

2023 Review of Parliamentary Constituencies

Response from the Liberal Democrats for South East at the initial consultation period

Peter Flake and Steven Scarrott 31 July 2021

1. Liberal Democrat Party Statement

- 1.1 This submission is made on behalf of the Liberal Democrats and the South East and South Central Liberal Democrats. It is being presented as an overall response to the Initial Proposals of the Boundary Commission following consultation with Liberal Democrat local parties, MPs, council groups and our wider membership.
- 1.2 We recognise that this review is an ongoing process, and we will be listening and learning at every stage. We reserve the right to alter our response at future stages of this process as new evidence emerges or to withhold comments on specific seat configurations at this stage of the process.
- 1.3 We note the statutory (Rule 5) considerations that Commission is taking into account throughout this Review:
- special geographical considerations, including in particular the size, shape and accessibility of a constituency;
- local government boundaries as they existed (or were in prospect) on 1 December 2020;
- · boundaries of existing constituencies;
- any local ties that would be broken by changes in constituencies; and
- the inconveniences attendant on such changes.
- 1.4 We agree with the Commission's approach to interpreting these considerations as laid out in paragraphs 27-36 of its Guide to the 2023 Review of Parliamentary Constituencies.
- 1.5 In Paragraph 31 of the Guide to the Review, the Commission states:
- "Wards are well-defined and well-understood units, which are generally indicative of areas which have a broad community of interest. Any division of a ward between constituencies would therefore risk breaking local ties, as well as adding complexity to both the task of Returning Officers in administering a Parliamentary election in the area, and the 'grass roots' co-ordination of political party activism. The BCE's view is therefore that wards should continue to be the default building block for constituencies." (BCE's emphasis).
- 1.6 In the same paragraph, the Commission goes on to limit the circumstances in which it would be prepared to split a ward:

- "• Where splitting a ward would significantly enhance the ability of the BCE to adhere to existing or prospective local authority boundaries (i.e. avoid constituencies crossing local authorities), maintain existing constituencies unchanged, and/or preserve local ties, without causing consequential significant problems for surrounding constituencies.
- Where the division of a ward would avoid the alternative of a significant 'domino effect' of change to a wide area if wards were to be kept whole.
- Where the division of a ward would avoid otherwise unacceptable outcomes forced by local geographical factors....."6.3 In Paragraph 31 of the Guide to the Review, the Commission states:
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- Where the division of a ward would avoid otherwise unacceptable outcomes forced by local geographical factors....."
- 1.8 We remain to be convinced that any of the three ward splits proposed in the South East Region meet the circumstances put forward by the Commission.
- 1.9 While we agree with the Commission's view, stated in paragraph 37, that orphan wards should be avoided, this is not a statutory (Rule 5) consideration. Where the choice is between respecting statutory considerations and avoiding an orphan ward, the Rule 5 considerations should take precedence.

- 1.10 Clearly it is not always possible to respect all of the statutory considerations whilst keeping all constituencies in the statutory range. Where we make alternative proposals, we will do so in a way which we believe better respect geography, local government boundaries, existing constituencies, and communities. We will also follow the Commission's own guidance.
- 1.11 The Commission has proposed to change the names of some constituencies even where there has been little or no change to their boundaries. We believe this should spark a debate about constituency names in general and in those seats where the Commission has chosen to change, or not to change, these names. We have therefore refrained, at this stage, from commenting on names except where we propose a change to boundaries or where we believe the name proposed by the Commission does not describe the seat.
- 1.12 In this initial response, we support the boundaries of 53 of the Commission's 91 proposed constituencies. There are a further seven proposed constituencies which we do not support but do not wish to put forward a counter- proposal at this stage. We put forward six counter-proposals involving 31 constituencies.
- 1.13 Our fifteen seat counter-proposal in the Berkshire/Hampshire/Surrey subregion repairs the damage to communities in Fareham, Knightwood, Andover, Basingstoke, Whitehill, and Thorpe Lea. It eliminates an unnecessary split ward. It moves 81,454 fewer electors.
- 1.14 Our three seat counter-proposal in Surrey repairs the damage to the community of Reigate. It repairs the division of the Mole Valley District. It moves 8,341 fewer electors.
- 1.15 Our two seat counter-proposal in Buckinghamshire eliminates an unnecessary split ward. It moves 3,964 fewer electors.
- 1.16 Our six seat counter-proposal in Kent eliminates a seat where the constituent parts are mutually inaccessible. It repairs the damage to the communities of Chatham, Larkfield, and Ashford. It puts together a compact urban constituency of Maidstone.
- 1.17 Our three seat counter-proposal in the Sussex sub-region prevents the Lewes District being divided into three. It moves 5,826 fewer electors.
- 1.18 Our two seat counter-proposal in the Isle of Wight repairs the damage to the community of Newport and reunites Cowes with East Cowes.

2. South East and sub-regions

- 2.1 We note the use of the Sainte-Laguë process to allocate 89 seats to the South East (plus two protected seats in the Isle of Wight), an increase of seven.
- 2.2 We note the Commission's decision to group South East Region (outside the Isle of Wight) into the following sub-regions:


- 2.3 We support the Commission's proposed sub-regions.
- 2.4 We consider that the Commission has, on the whole, done a good job in creating a scheme for the South East. We support the Commission's proposals for 53 constituencies. We reserve judgement on seven. We propose alternative arrangements for 31.

3. Berkshire/Hampshire/Surrey sub-region

- 3.1 We support the Commission's initial proposals for nineteen seats in the Berkshire/Hampshire/Surrey sub-region. We reserve judgement on two. We put forward one counter-proposal involving fifteen seats and another involving three.
- 3.2 In Berkshire we support six of the Commission's proposed seats: Bracknell, Earley and Woodley, Maidenhead, Reading, Slough, Wokingham.
- 3.3 The proposed Reading constituency is entirely made up of Reading Borough wards and includes the town centre.
- 3.4 The proposed Earley and Woodley seat puts together suburban areas which look towards Reading and are currently divided by convoluted boundaries between three constituencies.
- 3.5 The proposed Wokingham constituency is now entirely contained within the Wokingham Borough.

- 3.6 The proposed Bracknell seat is now entirely contained within the Bracknell Forest Unitary Authority. The inclusion of the Warfield Harvest Ride ward brings much more of the town of Bracknell into the constituency.
- 3,7 The proposed Maidenhead constituency, having lost its Wokingham Borough wards, gains that part of Bracknell Forest not in the Bracknell seat.
- 3.8 The proposed Slough seat loses part of Langley. It is unfortunate that at least one of Langley or Slough or Windsor must be divided. This seems the least worst option.
- 3.9 We reserve judgement on the proposed Mid Berkshire and Newbury constituencies. The ward split does not seem to meet the criteria set out in paragraphs 31 and 32 of the Commission's Guide to the Review. The main purpose of the ward split appears to be to allow the seat including Tilehurst to be called Mid Berkshire. We would propose that it be named Tilehurst. A decision on whether a ward split is justified, or whether a rearrangement of wards would suffice, could then be made.
- 3.10 In Hampshire we support nine of the Commission's proposed seats: Aldershot, East New Forest (although we suggest it remain New Forest East), Gosport, Havant, Portsmouth North, Portsmouth South, Southampton Itchen, Southampton Test, West New Forest (although we suggest it remain New Forest West).
- 3.11 Local government ward changes mean that Aldershot's boundary, without a ward split, must divide either Blackwater or Yateley. Neither is ideal but the proposed boundary is probably the least worst option.
- 3.12 The other eight constituencies we support are completely unchanged. Seven of them are composed of wards from one local authority area. The eighth, Gosport, contains a complete local authority area.
- 3.13 In Surrey we support four of the Commission's proposed seats: East Surrey, Esher and Walton, Spelthorne, Woking.
- 3.14 The proposed East Surrey constituency contains the whole of the Tandridge District together with the one Reigate and Banstead ward which is most closely aligned with it.
- 3.15 The proposed Esher and Walton seat loses a ward and continues to be made up entirely contained within Elmbridge.
- 3.16 The proposed Spelthorne constituency is unchanged and coterminous with its District.


- 3.17 The proposed Woking seat has lost two Guildford wards to become coterminous with its District.
- 3.18 We put forward a counter-proposal to fifteen of the Commission's proposed constituencies: Basingstoke, East Hampshire, Eastleigh, Fareham and Waterlooville, Farnham and Bordon, Godalming and Ash, Guildford, Hedge End, North East Hampshire, North West Hampshire, Romsey and Southampton North, Surrey Heath, Weybridge & Chertsey, Winchester, Windsor.
- 3.19 The Commission's proposed Fareham and Waterlooville seat contains parts of three local authorities. Its boundary with the proposed Hedge End constituency divides the town of Fareham:




We propose that the existing Fareham seat need only lose the Sarisbury ward and continue to be made up entirely of Fareham Borough wards.

3.20 The Commission's proposed arrangement in this part of Hampshire involves major change. We propose an Eastleigh constituency much closer to the current seat. Having gained Sarisbury ward from Fareham, it loses the Bishopstoke and the Fair Oak and Horton Heath wards.


- 3.21 The Commission's proposals split the Meon Valley seat asunder. We propose that it merely gain the Eastleigh wards of Bishopstoke and Fair Oak and Horton Heath and lose its East Hampshire wards.
- 3.22 This means that Winchester, instead of being subjected to major change, can be unchanged except to realign with new local authority ward boundaries.
- 3.23 This, in turn means that Romsey and Southampton North only needs to gain one ward Anna from North West Hampshire. More importantly it keeps the Valley Park ward, repairing the damage to the community of Knightwood divided in the Commission's proposal.



3.24 North West Hampshire does not need to gain the Sherborne St John and Rooksdown ward and can keep the Bellinger and Charlton and the Pentons ward. Charlton is part of the continuous urban area of Andover. Our proposal reunites it.



3.25 Sherborne St John and Rooksdown ward, which the Commission has proposed go into North West Hampshire, includes a slice of Northern Basingstoke including its hospital.




We propose that this ward be included in the Basingstoke constituency, along with the Bramley ward. There is no need for a ward split in the Oakley and the Candovers ward. No part of it should be in Basingstoke. We also propose that Chineham, which is separated from Basingstoke by the A33 not be in the Basingstoke seat.

3.26 We propose that the North East Hampshire seat should lose Bramley and gain Chineham. This means it does not need to have any part of Oakley and the Candovers.

3.27 The East Hampshire constituency can then gain the Oakley and the Candovers ward. This does mean it is an orphan ward but, although we have made Sarisbury an orphan ward, we have eliminated two other orphan wards in Hampshire (Valley Park, Whiteley and Shedfield). The Commission proposes to split Oakley and the Candovers which is an even greater indignity. This, in turn, means that East Hampshire can give up the Whitehill Hogmoor and Greatham ward.

3.28 The Commission's proposed Farnham and Bordon seat, which is the cross-county constituency between Hampshire and Surrey, has a boundary with East Hampshire which divides the community of Whitehill.



Including the Whitehill Hogmoor and Greatham ward in this seat repairs the damage to the community of Whitehill. It also allows the Elstead and Thursley ward to go into a Godalming seat.

3.29 The Commission proposes to put the predominantly urban three Ash wards into a Godalming and Ash constituency. We propose instead that Clandon and Horsley, Effingham, Lovelace and Send are added to a Godalming seat. These latter wards, being rural rather urban, are much more similar in character to the predominantly rural Godalming constituency, and, in common with the Waverley wards, are located within, and characterised by, the Surrey Hills. We consider this to be a far more suitable fit than combining the urban area of Ash with predominantly rural areas of Waverley which it has very little in common with and very poor transport links to.

3.30 Without the four rural wards to the east, the Guildford constituency can then link west to the Ash. Ash has much stronger links to Guildford than to Godalming and, like Guildford itself, has an overwhelmingly urban and suburban character. The Normandy and Pirbright wards lying between Guildford and Ash, would also be added. There are strong east-west connections between these wards by both road and rail, and many Ash residents work in Guildford, meaning


that our proposal offers a much more natural fit than the proposal for a Godalming and Ash constituency.

- 3.31 Without the Normandy and Pirbright wards, the Surrey Heath seat must gain electors. We propose that it gain the Longcross, Lyne & Chertsey South ward and the Virginia Water ward from the Weybridge and Chertsey constituency. We would argue that Longcross, Lyne & Chertsey South is a distinct community from Chertsey. The boundary is the M25 motorway. Virginia Water is also a distinct community in its own right. Both these wards abut and are partially characterised by Chobham Common which lies in Surrey Heath.
- 3.32 The Commission's proposed boundary between the Weybridge and Chertsey and Windsor seats divides the community of Thorpe Lea in Egham.



We propose that the two Egham wards remain in the Weybridge and Chertsey constituency and that, instead, the two Englefield Green wards be transferred into the Windsor seat. They have better links to Windsor. As the Egham wards would remain grouped with Chertsey and Weybridge, and contain the water meadow of Runnymede which gives Runnymede district its name, we consider that retaining the name of Runnymede and Weybridge for the constituency would be appropriate.

3.33 We do not propose any change within Berkshire to the Windsor constituency.





- 3.35 We put forward a counter-proposal to the Commission's initial proposals for the Dorking and Horley, Epsom and Ewell, Reigate constituencies.
- 3.36 The Commission's proposals unnecessarily divide the Mole Valley District. They also divide the town of Reigate.



- 3.37 We propose a Mole Valley constituency which contains the whole Mole Valley District, keeping the communities of Leatherhead and Fetcham which have strong links. It also contains the orphan Reigate and Banstead ward of Lower Kingswood Tadworth and Walton. While avoiding orphan wards is a desirable objective, it is not a statutory (Rule 5) consideration. Respecting local authority boundaries is such a statutory consideration. We believe it should have priority.
- 3.38 We propose an Epsom and Ewell seat which gives up its Mole Valley wards but encompasses the whole of Epsom and Ewell Borough in addition to keeping the Reigate and Banstead wards of Nork and of Tattenham and Preston. While this continues the division of the communities of Banstead, it does so along an existing parliamentary boundary, most of which runs along the A217.

3.39 We propose a Reigate seat which contains the whole of the towns of Reigate, Redhill and Horley and is entirely composed of Reigate and Banstead Borough wards.



4. Buckinghamshire sub-region

- 4.1 We support the boundaries, although not necessarily the names, of six of the Commission's proposed seats in the sub-region: Aylesbury, Buckingham and Bletchley, High Wycombe, Marlow and South Buckinghamshire, Milton Keynes, Newport Pagnell. We put forward a counter-proposal for the proposed Chesham and Amersham and Princes Risborough constituencies.
- 4.2 The Commission particularly asked for views about the boundaries and names of its two proposed constituencies entirely within the Milton Keynes Unitary Authority. We support the Commission's proposed boundaries for these two seats. The boundary between them largely follows main roads within Milton Keynes and the M1 motorway. The names, however, do not adequately describe them. We propose that Newport Pagnell be renamed Milton Keynes North and that Milton Keynes be renamed Milton Keynes Central.
- 4.3 We support the Commission's proposed Buckingham and Bletchley constituency. One seat has to cross the boundary between Buckinghamshire and Milton Keynes. This seems the neatest option.
- 4.4 We support the Commission's proposed Aylesbury constituency. It is unfortunate that a small part of the community of Aylesbury in the Wendover Halton and Stoke Mandeville ward is detached, but all of the alternatives have knock on effects which would create greater problems.

- 4.5 We support the Commission's proposed High Wycombe seat. The loss of the Hazlemere ward represents minimum change.
- 4.6 The support the boundaries, but not the name, of the Commission's proposed Marlow and South Buckinghamshire constituency. The loss of the Beaconsfield ward represents minimum change. As in the case of Aylesbury, a small part of the community of Beaconsfield is detached, but it is not possible in this part of the county to avoid such an outcome. We would suggest that the seat is called either Marlow or South Buckinghamshire, but not both.
- 4.7 The Commission proposed to split the Chiltern Ridges ward. The ward split does not seem to meet the criteria set out in paragraphs 31 and 32 of the Commission's Guide to the Review. Its purpose seems to be to allow the Hazlemere ward to be added to Chesham and Amersham. We propose that Chesham and Amersham constituency retain the whole of the Chiltern Ridges ward and that the Hazlemere ward go into the Princes Risborough seat, which we would suggest can then be renamed West Buckinghamshire:



5. Kent sub-region

5.1 We support ten of the Commission's proposed constituencies in Kent. We reserve judgement on two. We put forward a counter-proposal for six.


- 5.2 The Commission's proposed Sittingbourne and Sheppey seat remains entirely composed of Swale Borough wards. It is unfortunate that a small part of the Sittingbourne community is removed, but we can see no alternative.
- 5.3 The Commission's proposed Gillingham and Rainham constituency is unchanged and entirely composed of Medway UA wards.
- 5.4 The Commission's proposed Gravesham constituency is unchanged and coterminous with its District.
- 5.5 The Commission's proposed Tonbridge seat is, like its predecessor, made up of wards from two districts.
- 5.6 The Commission's proposed Tunbridge Wells constituency loses a ward and is completely made up of Tunbridge Wells Borough wards.
- 5.7 The Commission's proposed Folkestone and Hythe seat is now composed entirely of Folkestone and Hythe District wards.
- 5.8 The Commission's proposed Canterbury seat only loses part of a divided ward. It remains entirely composed of Canterbury City wards.
- 5.9 The Commission's proposed Dover and Deal constituency is unchanged in its boundaries except to realign with new local authority ward boundaries. It remains entirely composed of Dover District wards.
- 5.10 The Commission's proposal to reorientate the Thanet seats allows the community of Margate, which was previously divided, to be reunited in one constituency.
- 5.11 We reserve judgement on the Commission's proposed Dartford and Sevenoaks constituencies. Part of the community of Dartford, in the Wilmington Sutton-at-Hone and Hawley ward, has been detached from the Dartford seat. A different choice of Dartford ward/s to join Sevenoaks could resolve this.
- 5.12 We put forward a counter-proposal to the Commission's proposed Ashford, Chatham and Aylesford, Faversham and Mid Kent, Maidstone and Malling, Rochester and Strood, and Weald of Kent constituencies.
- 5.13 The Commission's proposed Chatham and Aylesford seat is divided by the River Medway. There is no bridge crossing of the river within the constituency.




5.14 Paragraph 36 of the Guide to the Review states:

As far as possible, the BCE seeks to create constituencies:

- from wards that are adjacent to each other; and
- that do not contain 'detached parts', i.e. where the only physical connection between one part of the constituency and the remainder would require travel through a different constituency.
- 5.15 Our counter-proposal would eliminate this problem.
- 5.16 The Commission proposes to transfer the Rochester South and Horsted ward from Rochester and Strood to Chatham and Aylesford, dividing the community of Rochester. We propose, instead that the River ward be transferred to the Chatham seat. This still divides the community of Rochester, but it unites the community of Chatham, putting the historic dockyard into a Chatham constituency.



5.17 The boundary between the proposed Chatham and Aylesford and Maidstone and Malling seats cuts through the community of Larkfield.



5.18 We propose that all the Tonbridge and Malling wards which the Commission have allocated to their proposed Chatham and Aylesford and Maidstone and Malling seats should be in a Malling constituency together with five rural Maidstone Borough wards – Barming and Teston, Boughton Monchelsea and Chart Sutton, Coxheath and Hunton, Marden and Yalding, and Staplehurst.


5.19 Chatham can then be coupled with seven rural Maidstone Borough wards – Boxley, Detling and Thurnham, Harrietsham and Lenham, Headcorn, Leeds, North Downs, Sutton Valence and Langley – to form a Chatham and Leeds constituency.

5.20 This means that the urban Maidstone Borough wards, which the Commission proposes to divide between three seats, can form a compact Maidstone constituency.


5.21 We then propose to combine the Swale Borough wards which the Commission proposes to be part of the Faversham and Mid Kent seat, the Tunbridge Wells Borough wards it proposes to be part of the Weald of Kent seat,

together with all but one of the Ashford Borough wards it proposes to be part of both, in a Faversham and Tenterden constituency.

5.22 The Commission proposes to divide the community of Ashford. The Kingsnorth Village and Bridgefield ward is made up of the village of Kingsnorth and Bridgefield which is very much part of the Park Farm estate in Ashford.



- 5.23 We propose to repair this division by keeping the Kingsnorth Village and Bridgefield ward in the Ashford constituency.
- 5.24 Our counter-proposal eliminates a seat where the constituent parts are mutually inaccessible. It repairs the damage to the communities of Chatham, Larkfield, and Ashford. It puts together a compact urban constituency of Maidstone. The Boroughs of Ashford and of Tonbridge and Malling are each divided into parts of only two (instead of three) constituencies.

6. Oxfordshire sub-region


- 6.1 We support all seven of the Commission's proposed constituencies in Oxfordshire. With an increase of one seat in a small county, radical changes have to be made.
- 6.2 The Commission's proposed Henley seat is now entirely made up of South Oxfordshire District wards and is confined to the east of the River Thames.
- 6.3 The Commission's proposed Oxford East constituency loses electors in the city centre and continues to be entirely composed of Oxford City wards.
- 6.4 The Commission's proposed Oxford West and Abingdon seat, having gained the centre of Oxford, then loses Kidlington in Cherwell to become more compact and based on only two local authorities.
- 6.5 The Commission's proposed Bicester constituency is essentially the new seat in the county. It combines Bicester and other Cherwell wards from Banbury, the parts of Cherwell District removed from Henley and Oxford West and Abingdon with the eastern part of West Oxfordshire District.

- 6.6 The Commission's proposed Banbury constituency, having lost Bicester, has to gain parts of the West Oxfordshire District around Chipping Norton.
- 6.7 The Commission's proposed Witney seat then has to gain Vale of White Horse wards.
- 6.8 Finally the Commission's proposed Didcot and Wantage constituency loses territory to Wantage.

7. Sussex sub-region

- 7.1 We support eleven of the Commission's proposed constituencies. We reserve judgement on three. We put forward a counter-proposal for three.
- 7.2 In West Sussex we support the Commission's proposals for the Bognor Regis, Chichester, Crawley, Horsham, Mid Sussex constituencies.
- 7.3 The proposed Bognor Regis seat has good internal communications.
- 7.4 The proposed Chichester constituency continues to be entirely contained in the Chichester District.
- 7.5 Horsham loses its Mid Sussex wards and becomes entirely contained in the Horsham District.
- 7.6 Crawley is proposed to remain unchanged and coterminous with its District.
- 7.7 The Commission's proposed Mid Sussex seat is much more geographically coherent than its predecessor. It continues to be entirely contained in the Mid Sussex District.
- 7.8 We reserve judgement on the Commission's proposed Arundel and Littlehampton, Shoreham, and Worthing constituencies. We feel that the division of the Adur District and of the community of Lancing could be avoided.
- 7.9 In East Sussex we support the boundaries of the Commission's proposals for Bexhill and Battle, Brighton Kemptown, Brighton Pavilion, Eastbourne, Hastings and Rye, Hove and Brighton West.
- 7.10 We support the unchanged boundaries of the Hove seat. We are baffled by the name change. If it is going to be Hove and anything, it should be Hove and Portslade.
- 7.11 We support the Commission's proposed Brighton Pavilion and Brighton Kemptown constituencies. The ward swap enables the preservation of the existing eastern boundary.

- 7.12 We support the Commission's proposed Eastbourne seat. It loses its Wealden wards to become coterminous with its Borough.
- 7.13 We support the Commission's proposed Bexhill and Battle and Hastings and Rye constituencies. Both have had to lose electors. Both have become more compact as a result.
- 7.14 We put forward a counter-proposal to the Commission's proposed East Grinstead and Uckfield, Hailsham and Crowborough, and Lewes constituencies.
- 7.15 The Commission has unnecessarily further divided the Lewes District. We propose that the Lewes seat should keep all its Lewes District wards and instead lose Polegate which is adjacent to Hailsham.
- 7.16 We then propose that East Grinstead should be linked with Crowborough. This avoids cutting Crowborough off from its hinterland to the West. The proposed constituency of East Grinstead and Crowborough covers two districts rather than three.
- 7.17 We propose that Hailsham should be linked to Uckfield. This avoids cutting Uckfield off from its hinterland to the East.
- 7.18 It has been suggested that the long thin Danehill and Fletching ward might benefit from a ward split. It is our view that "making it look good on the map" is not one of the criteria laid down by the Commission in paragraphs 31 and 32 of the Guide to the Review.



8. Isle of Wight

- 8.1 It is accepted that the Isle of Wight should have two parliamentary seats. We take the view that an east/west split offers the best option. We agree with Commission that the spirit of the legislation is best observed by creating two constituencies with roughly equal electorates.
- 8.2 The Commission's proposed boundary divides the Medina Valley comprising Newport, the Island's county town and two other significant neighbouring towns, Cowes and East Cowes. Newport is the Island's main commercial centre and headquarters to the Island's main public sector employers including the Isle of Wight Council, the Isle of Wight NHS Trust and St Mary's Hospital, HM Prison (Isle

of Wight), the Isle of Wight College and the Island Headquarters of the Police. Newport is divided in the Commission's proposal:



8.3 Our counter-proposal, transferring the East Cowes, Fairlee and Whippingham, Osborne wards from East to West, and moving the Newchurch Havenstreet and Ashey, Ventnor and St Lawrence, Wroxhall Lowtherville and Bonchurch wards the other way, repairs the damage to Newport and reunites Cowes with East Cowes:

9. Conclusion

- 9.1 We recognise that this review is an ongoing process, and we will be listening and learning at every stage.
- 9.2 We agree with the Commission's approach to interpreting the statutory (Rule 5) considerations as laid out in paragraphs 27-36 of its Guide to the 2023 Review of Parliamentary Constituencies.
- 9.3 Clearly it is not always possible to respect all of the statutory considerations whilst keeping all constituencies in the statutory range. Where we make alternative proposals, we will do so in a way which we believe better respect these considerations and the Commission's guidance.
- 9.4 We believe the Commission's proposals on constituency names should spark a debate about constituency names in general and for specific seats. We have therefore, on the whole, refrained, at this stage, from commenting on names except where we propose a change to boundaries or where we believe the name proposed by the Commission does not adequately describe the seat.
- 9.5 In this initial response, we support the boundaries of 53 of the Commission's 91 proposed constituencies. There are a further seven proposed constituencies

- which we do not support but do not wish to put forward a counter-proposal at this stage. We put forward six counter-proposals involving 31 constituencies.
- 9.6 Our fifteen seat counter-proposal in the Berkshire/Hampshire/Surrey subregion repairs the damage to communities in Fareham, Knightwood, Andover, Basingstoke, Whitehill, and Thorpe Lea. It eliminates an unnecessary split ward. It moves 81,454 fewer electors. It keeps the Winchester constituency unchanged except to realign with new local authority ward boundaries.
- 9.7 Our three seat counter-proposal in Surrey repairs the damage to the community of Reigate. It repairs the division of the Mole Valley District. It moves 8,341 fewer electors.
- 9.8 Our two seat counter-proposal in Buckinghamshire eliminates an unnecessary split ward. It moves 3,964 fewer electors.
- 9.9 Our six seat counter-proposal in Kent eliminates a seat where the constituent parts are mutually inaccessible. It repairs the damage to the communities of Chatham, Larkfield, and Ashford. It puts together a compact urban constituency of Maidstone.
- 9.10 Our three seat counter-proposal in the Sussex sub-region prevents the Lewes District being divided into three. It moves 5,826 fewer electors.
- 9.11 Our two seat counter-proposal in the Isle of Wight repairs the damage to the community of Newport and reunites Cowes with East Cowes.
